Ahead of the opening of Expo 2025 Osaka, Kansai, Japan, the European Union (EU) will announce details about the EU Pavilion, the official uniform, and a series of events to be held during the Expo, including "Europe Day".



EU Pavilion: Step into the Future as Envisioned by the EU through Immersive

The EU Pavilion at Expo 2025 Osaka is designed with inspiration from the three principles of the "New European Bauhaus" – sustainability, aesthetics and inclusion. Immersive installations and digital activities, such as the "Zen Robot Installation" and "Talking Plants," are more than exhibitions, offering spaces for discovery, dialogue and interaction. These installations embody the theme of the EU Pavilion, "Nurturing Tomorrow". Visitors will have the opportunity to experience the EU's vision for the future as they explore the pavilion.

■ EU Pavilion Details

The Facade

Inspired by Japanese ema plaques and the precision of origami, the facade features rotating, petal-like modules made from sustainable bamboo, a material chosen for its durability, lightness, and environmental performance. These elements move naturally with the wind, mirroring the graceful motion of sakura blossoms and bringing the EU's theme, "Nurturing Tomorrow," to life.

By day, its lightweight structure plays with natural light and shadow, while at night, dynamic LED illumination enhances its vibrancy.



Talking Plants

Touch a digital plant to watch its virtual twin grow and reveal fascinating insights into EU initiatives on sustainable agriculture, food safety, and green alliances.

Inspired by Japan's origami culture, fold your own digital dove and release it into the installation, symbolising hope and cooperation.

Official EU Pavilion Uniform with Sustainability and Functionality







The design competition for the EU's official uniform at Expo 2025 Osaka took place in the autumn of 2024. Among the applicants, all of whom were fashion students from across the EU, Tomáš Maliňak from Slovakia was selected. Over the following months, Maliňak worked under the guidance of Kunihiko Morinaga, founder and designer of the renowned Japanese fashion brand "ANREALAGE," to enhance his design.

Inspired by the theme of the Expo, "Designing Future Society for Our Lives," and the EU's "Nurturing Tomorrow", Maliňak's design embodies the spirit of the EU and the guiding values of the New European Bauhaus. Maliňak's design is not only aesthetically beautiful and unmistakably European, but also sustainable and inclusive.

The official uniform is designed to ensure comfort for all, regardless of gender, body shape or colour palette. It consists of a button-down denim vest, a knitted polo shirt and high-waisted denim trousers, balancing both form and function. Advanced production technologies, such as pattern generation and 3D visualization, were employed alongside certified-sustainable fabrics. The uniform features 100% cotton, lightweight, breathable 3D-patterned fabric for comfortable wearing in all weather conditions while offering a flattering, relaxed silhouette for any body type. Maliňak's design is entirely produced in Europe. Honouring his Slovakian heritage and the fact that he is currently pursuing a degree in Prague, the uniforms are hand-sewn in Slovakia using fabric sourced from Czechia.

Upcoming EU events

A variety of exciting events will take place at the EU Pavilion throughout the Expo. Europe Day, which marks the anniversary of the EU's founding, is the most important occasion to honour peace, unity and the future of Europe. To commemorate this special day, the EU will host a diverse lineup of events, reflecting the strong ties between European nations and further strenghting relations with other partners.

On Europe Day, which honours peace, unity and the future of Europe, the EU will host various initiatives and performances from EU Member States in the EU Pavilion and all around the expo site, focusing on showcasing the strong ties between the European countries and further strengthening relations with world partners. The events will centre around the EU's core values of unity, solidarity and diversity with cutting-edge performances that blend music, digital art and dance. The EU will collaborate with the Jellyfish Pavilion to present a children's programme titled "Tales from Europe". Starting on Europe Day, an EU Stamp Rally will encourage visitors to explore the pavilions of EU member countries and collect stamps. This unique experience, celebrating Europe's culture and diversity, offers visitors the opportunity to engage with the various pavilions while enjoying both entertainment and educational activities.

A back-to-back DJ set featuring Krikor Kouchian and MAYUDEPTH (electro, techno). Their set will be complemented by original works by Jackson Kaki and Shinsuke Yamaji to create an immersive contemporary performance at the intersection of music and visual arts.



The European Union Youth Orchestra

The European Union Youth Orchestra is a youth orchestra with members drawn from the EU's 27 Member States. Since its foundation in 1976, it has connected music colleges and the professional music world for generations of European musicians. The brass quintet will march around the Expo site during the day and visit other pavilions.

■ Animation Residency Kickoff Event

Expo 2025 Osaka will bring people from around the world to Japan, creating a unique opportunity to bridge cultural and creative differences through the universal language of animation.
