The European Union (EU) will host its first-ever "New European Bauhaus (NEB)" keynote and interactive event, titled "NEB Comes to Osaka: Shaping the Future of Cities – Design, Technology, and Democracy" at Expo 2025 Osaka-Kansai on Tuesday, May 13, 2025.

This event, aligned with the Expo's overarching theme "Designing Future Society for Our Lives," will explore sustainable, inclusive, and beautiful urban futures. It will feature a keynote speech by European Commission Vice-President Henna Virkkunen, followed by an international panel discussion with thought leaders from Asia and Europe, and an open networking session to inspire creative dialogue.

A Finnish politician, Henna Virkkunen has served as **Vice-President of the European Commission** (in charge of Technology Sovereignty, Security, and Democracy) since December 2024. A member of the National Coalition Party and the European People's Party (EPP), she was first elected to the Finnish Parliament in 2007 and has held roles including Minister of Education and Minister of Transport and Local Government. From 2014 to 2024, she was a Member of the European Parliament (MEP), working on industry, research, and energy policy. Her focus areas include AI, quantum technology, cybersecurity, and addressing social media addiction.
